

THE PENNSYLVANIA GOSPEL MUSIC HALL OF FAME by Randy Simpson

Each year, the PSGMA inducts 3 individuals into the Pennsylvania Gospel Music Hall of Fame. In October 2022, another three well deserving individuals joined the Pennsylvania Gospel Music Hall of Fame Alumni.

The first of those individuals is Barb Yurasek. Barb Yurasek was born June 22, 1944 in Mineral Point, PA. She has lived in PA all of her life. As a child,

she attended Conemaugh Church of the Brethren. At age 9, Barb contracted polio. Her earliest memories of Gospel Music came around age 13, when she heard The Couriers for the very first time. After that, hearing The Cathedral Trio was on the Rex Humbard program. Barb recalls how the Gospel Music lifted her spiritually, helping her through a



very difficult physical time of her young life. One experience she will never forget was attending the National Quartet Convention in Louisville, KY in 1994. Barb has served Gospel Music in several facets for many years. Early on, she supported The Couriers and other ministries financially, and attended many, many concerts. Eventually working the product table and even running sound for Steel City Quartet. Barb feels it to be an honor to serve Christ for many years. Barb now resides in Ebensburg, PA, and certainly deserves this induction into the Pennsylvania Southern Gospel Music Association Hall of Fame.

The second individual to be inducted this year is John McPherson. John was born in Camden, NJ in September of 1954. Spending a lot of years in NJ, John has now lived in Pennsylvania for the past 17 years. As a young child, John attended the First Baptist Church. John recalls as a teenager, watching the Gospel Music Jubilee while doing an apprenticeship at a TV repair shop. He learned to repair TV's, and learned to enjoy Gospel

Music. John has spent many years traveling and singing and here is a list - John sang 10 years with The Masters Quartet, 11 years with The Messengers Quartet, several years with New Life Freedom Singers, as well as March Forth, 12 years with Mercy's Vessel and the last 4



years with the Fellowship Quartet. Just a few years back, his group Mercy's Vessel was awarded the PSGMA Keystone Award. John considers it nothing but JOY (and even fun) to serve Jesus. John recalls singing in NJ one Sunday morning



and after the concert, gave an invitation, and almost the entire congregation came forward to receive Christ. We congratulate John on his induction into the Pennsylvania Southern Gospel Music Association Hall of Fame.

The third individual to be inducted this year is John Palm (now deceased). John was born March of 1943, attended and graduated from Big Spring High School (Newville, PA) in 1961.

John was a member of St. Matthews Evangelical Lutheran Church in Plainfield, PA for many years.

John was known for many things. He was a well-known auto mechanic, specializing in auto air conditioning. He was known for his love of gardening, and most of all, John loved Gospel Music. John promoted gospel concerts in the

He not only attended thousands of concerts, but also supported many of his favorite gospel artists through financial giving and prayer, and spiritual support as well. John is greatly missed by many. 



Historian's Corner

Interview with PSGMA Hall Of Fame Recipient: Dr. Bill Dykes



Greetings and welcome back to the first edition of the 2023 Historian's Corner. I trust that you had a great winter and Christmas and New Year. As we are now in Spring, we are all looking forward to Gospel Concerts and

the encouragement and God glorifying ministry that they bring. Continuing the Historian Corner focus on Pennsylvania Southern Gospel Music Association (PSGMA) Hall of Fame inductees, this *Keystone Quarterly (KQ) contains an interview* of an extraordinary, God-fearing man, whom I had the privilege to meet in 2018, Dr. Bill Dykes. Dr. Dykes was a member of the PSGMA Board of Directors (BOD) from 2018-2020, and was inducted into the PSGMA HOF in 2018. Dr. Dykes, with his responsibility and position at the Open Door Church in Chambersburg, PA, was able to establish a meeting place for the PSGMA board for two years. This was amazing, as the board did not have a place to meet at that time. We were all praying for a place to meet, and God answered those prayers through Dr. Dykes.

I say that he is extraordinary, not only because of his vast accomplishments, of which he has many, but because of his parallel path in singing Gospel Music with many groups. They include: the Cathedrals, Jerry and the Singing Goffs and others, but also what he has done to help churches with financial management in getting them started and on solid financial ground, as well as the spiritual impact that he has made in the lives of many people. Currently, he is the Seniors Pastor at Music City Baptist Church in Nashville, Tennessee. I am sure, like me, you will get to know more about Dr. Dykes, and you will be laughing at times and crying at times, as I found myself doing:

Keystone Quarterly (KQ): When did you first

get started in Southern Gospel Music?

Bill Dykes (BD): 56 years ago, with the Chancellor Quartet out of Hamilton, Ohio.

KQ: What was the motivation behind getting involved in Southern Gospel Music? How many groups did you sing in, how many did you start and what were the names of the groups?

BD: Pastor Howard Dykes, Sr. and my mom, Madelyn, took me to a concert in Cincinnati to hear the Blackwood Brothers and the Statesmen Quartet. I was hooked! I sang in 8 groups and started one... Chariot. The names of the groups I sang in were: The Chancellor Quartet, the Rhythm Masters, Coy Cook and the Senators, The Cathedrals, Jerry and the Singing Goffs, Landmark Quartet, The Crownsmen, and Chariot.

KQ: Describe your experience working with The Cathedrals and in particular, your interaction with the late, great George Younce and Glen Payne. Can you describe a very serious event where perhaps you, George, and Glen led someone to the Lord? Also, please reflect on one of the most humorous situations with the Cathedrals that you would like to share with our Keystone Quarterly readers.

BD: It was a great honor and privilege to work with one of the nation's top gospel music groups. Usually, we sang and the pastor led the invitation; on a personal level, all of us took leading people to the Lord very seriously, but it was on a one-on-one basis. One Sunday morning, when we were coming back from a group of concerts down south, there was a terrible snow storm. We were on highway 81; I will never forget it... There was Glen, George, Roy, George Amon Webster and me... Bud Seeker was driving the bus and he lost control of the bus; we went down one of the mountains on Hwy 81 and the bus

cartwheeled one time and landed on a concrete abutment at the foot of the mountain; it split the back part of the bus as it hit the concrete! The bus was laying on its side, we were screaming and hollering for each other, making sure everyone was OK; thank God, everyone was fine. We were all disoriented, to say the least; but I went looking for my hairpiece, as I did not want anyone seeing me without it! George asked me what I was doing and I told him I NEEDED to get to my hairpiece in the closet. George told me I was STANDING ON THE CLOSET DOOR as the bus was on its side and there was no way I was getting it out. I laugh about that to this day!

KQ: I read your bio and you were what we "church people" call, a PK, or Pastor's Kid. Later, in your life you have gone on to be a Pastor, and in fact now, you serve as Seniors Pastor at Music City Baptist Church in Mount Juliet, Tennessee, outside of Nashville. Please describe what it was like growing up being a PK and now as a Pastor. We know God's word has spanned time and according to Paul in 2 Timothy 3:16, "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness." However, the church has changed since the time when you were a PK and now as a Pastor. What are some of the most impactful ways the church has changed over the time that you have been involved with the church?

BD: It was a privilege being brought up as a PK; in my opinion I had 2 of the most godly parents a person could ever have. At Dad's church in Georgetown, Ohio, he did not have anyone to direct the music; so, at 12 years old, Dad let me know that I was the new music director. Needless to say, I was in a panic and our organist, bless her heart, was 90 years old and could barely see or hear me, so we usually ended up going two different directions. In all the 76 years that I have lived and served, I have noticed a massive change in people's lack of true dedication to the church to serve; and many people don't even see the need of going to church, but yet they profess Christianity.

And yet, God stated over and over again that the importance of fellowship, being dedicated to ministry, the importance of loving on each other, lifting each other; and that is so hard to do when you are disconnected. That is the major change I have seen. Since the pandemic, many people still use the excuse of not coming to church; 'we will just watch it online' is their response. But they miss out on one of the most important aspects of being a Christian and that is fellowshipping one with another and supporting your church and your Pastor.

KQ: In your bio, it says that you have also developed an impressive resume of commercial banking, financial management, media, marketing, to just name a few of the positions that you have held. When you couple that with your singing career and family life, that makes for a very busy Dr. Bill Dykes. How were you able to balance it all and effectively manage your time in all of these activities, and still honor God?

BD: It was NOT easy. Once I started into my professional banking career, thank God I had great bosses; most of them were Christians, so I was able to work out situations with them where I would always be the first one to arrive at work and all I wanted was to be able to leave at Noon on Friday, to be able to get to my singing/speaking engagements by that evening. This way, I could always perform on Friday night, Saturday night, and twice on Sunday. I also had such a passion to help the church find financial resources to grow and develop.

KQ: In your bio, you had mentioned performing on 32 albums, producing over 200 albums for other performers, and that you wrote and performed the Gold Record winning song, "This is Love." Please tell our readers who might not be familiar with "This is Love", the theme and message of the song, and how and why you were inspired to write the song.

BD: The inspiration for the song, "This is Love", came from a message that I heard and the

message was: there is no greater love that you will ever experience like the love of God. The love of God is the greatest love because He gave EVERYTHING, including His life, that we might have life and have it more abundantly. That was my inspiration for the song, "This is Love".

KQ: If you were to pick the top 3 achievements during your long career in Southern Gospel Music, what would they be?

BD: Seeing so many people come to know the Lord at the end of every 3-day crusade with Jerry and the Singing Goffs, being able to help with financing some new groups that did not have the capital to actually record a project, and the privilege of representing Gospel music at the 1976 World Olympics in Montreal, Canada and sing about Jesus.

KQ: In 2018, you were inducted into the Pennsylvania Southern Gospel Music Association Hall of Fame, and in your biography you list this award as one of your most prestigious awards. Can you share with the readers why this award was one of your most prestigious awards? I also noticed that in your 56-year career singing for the Lord, that you were nominated for three Dove Awards and one Gospel News Award. Can you describe more specifically what the nominations were for?

BD: With so much talent out there today singing gospel music, the very fact of being singled out for singing the greatest music that has ever been written and receiving an award for doing what God simply called me to do was humbling. They were not actually for me personally; they were for the groups I was with at the time and that would be The Cathedral and Jerry and the Singing Goffs.

KQ. Many groups focus their travel domestically. How much international travel have you and your groups done over the years, and what has been the most memorable international concert/event? What are some of the challenges with singing overseas?

BD: The only one I can really think of was in Newfoundland at the Lord Beaverbrook Hotel with the Catherdrals; Jerry Goff offered me a position to move to Music City, a place I always wanted to live, and I then joined Jerry and the Singing Goffs.

KQ: I first met you in 2018; in that short time, you had given me the impression that prayer is a very important part of your life. Specifically, how has prayer impacted the decisions and focus of your ministry, and give a couple of examples of how God answered specific prayers of yours and your groups?

BD: All I want to say about this question is that every morning I have my Cheerios, my banana, my cup of coffee, and I read the Word of God, and I seek God in prayer; and will tell you that 99% of the time, before I ever do anything or make a move, it will be because of the answers that I get while I am seeking God in my time of devotions.

KQ: You mentioned in your bio that you have performed for the likes of Jerry Falwell, Pat Robertson, Rex Humbard, Billy Graham, Oral Roberts; and most recently, which I found fascinating, that you performed with former Governor of Arkansas, Mike Huckabee, whose daughter, Sarah Huckabee-Sanders, was elected as the youngest Governor of Arkansas at this past election. I have seen the Huckabee Show and have seen Governor Huckabee play the bass guitar. What was that experience like performing with Governor Huckabee? Also, when you performed for Billy Graham, was that at one of his famous stadium crusades, and if so, please briefly describe that experience.

BD: Performing with Gov. Huckabee was at Johnson City, New York, for a fundraiser at Davis Bible College; I served on the board for there 14 years with my dear friend, the President, Dr. Dino Pedrone. I sang and Gov. Huckabee spoke and we raised a ton of money for the college. When I performed for Billy Graham, it was at his stadium crusade in Lexington, KY. I was 16 years old and I was with Ontario Bible School and had a solo with the choir backing me up. It was so special

and a privilege to do this.

KQ: What advice do you have for young Christian singers who want to form a Gospel Group, and follow in the footsteps of people like Pastor Bill Dykes?

BD: Make sure it is part of God's plan and God's will for your life before you take a step of faith to follow His will for your life. The one thing that I do know, if it is part of His will and plan, you will know it without a shadow of a doubt, because it will never be easy; but it will always be worth it.

KQ: What challenges or opportunities do you see for Southern Gospel music going forward? I have seen many groups add contemporary and or praise and worship style music to their repertoire to try and capture the younger audience. What are your thoughts on how to capture the younger audience, in addition to our more senior saints, who tend to be the largest supporters of Southern Gospel music, in order to preserve the genre in the future?

BD: Don't try to figure it out on your own. Be open to listening to the Holy Spirit and let Him lead and guide and direct you in what path you should take.

KQ: These are trying times in which we live. I personally am reminded of Isaiah 41:10, which was a verse that my children had to memorize in their Sunday School class when we lived in Washington State; and they would be rewarded with a Bible by their Sunday School teacher. Isaiah 41:10 says, "Fear thou not, for I am with thee; be not dismayed, for I am thy God; I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness." As a pastor, what encouragement do you have for our readers who may be struggling or have issues in their lives, some of which are caused by the uncertainty that we see going on in the world?

BD: Proverbs 3:5,6 says "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him,

and he shall direct thy paths."

KQ: Last, but not least, what do you see as the future of Dr. Bill Dykes and Southern Gospel Music?

BD: I don't see myself anywhere in Southern Gospel Music. I see myself serving as Senior Pastor and Associate to Dr. Ben Graham, striving at all costs to win people to Jesus, whether that be with music, speaking, or just one on one leading people to Jesus.

KQ: Dr. Dykes, thank you so much for your time in participating in this interview for the Historian's Corner. Your answers were very inspiring and informative. I got to know a lot more about you, and all that you have done to further the Good News, the Gospel of Christ. For those of you who don't have your Bibles handy when reading the article, Dr. Dykes suggested Proverbs 3:5-6 as a scripture passage to give encouragement to those who are struggling and having issues in their lives. King Solomon, the wisest man in the world, and son of David, wrote much of the book of Proverbs. He also wrote Ecclesiastes and Song of Solomon. In Proverbs 3:5+6, Solomon, inspired by the Holy Spirit wrote, "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths." That passage has given me encouragement and guidance when I am seeking answers and reminds us to not rely on our own knowledge, but go to Him who states, "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts." Isaiah 55:8-9 KJV.

Isn't it good to know that we have an advocate and one who we can go to, that is omniscient (all knowing), omnipresent (everywhere) and omnipotent (all powerful) in the time of need and understanding, when the world repeatedly tells us that the solution resides within us so we should look to ourselves for the answer?

As Dr. Dykes concluded, he sees himself striving at all costs to win people to Jesus through the gifts that God has given him of music, speaking and exhortation (encouraging) in leading people to Jesus, "Neither is there salvation in any other; for there is no other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved." Acts 4:12 KJV. I encourage you who know Jesus as your Lord and Savior to do likewise. Paul, in his second letter to the Corinthians, said, "For He saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I helped thee; behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation."




















TRIBUTE TO PAUL



LEGENDARY SOUTHERN GOSPEL MUSIC ASSOCIATION HALL OF FAME MEMBER, ED O'NEAL, ANNOUNCES RETIREMENT OF THE DIXIE MELODY BOYS' NAME

Kinston, NC - Many talented vocalists and musicians step onto concert stages across the country year after year; however, only the faithful and dedicated overcome the pressures of life on the road. Ed O'Neal, whose name has been synonymous with Gospel Music for more than 60 years, can certainly be labeled as one of the faithful and dedicated. Now, after six celebrated decades, O'Neal has announced the retirement of The Dixie Melody Boys' name.

O'Neal joined The Dixie Melody Boys in 1961 and became owner and manager of the quartet a few years later. Over the years, O'Neal and The Dixie Melody Boys have enjoyed tremendous success, including countless hits and a Grammy nomination. In 2000, O'Neal was named recipient of the Marvin Norcross Award, the highest honor presented at the time during The Singing News Fan Awards Ceremony. Additionally in 2004, he was inducted into the Southern Gospel Music Association Hall of Fame.

While success has abounded, as is the case with most quartets, adversities have also been encountered. In fact, over the past six decades, O'Neal has seen more than 90 personnel changes - quite possibly a record in the Southern Gospel Music world, O'Neal admits. "In all seriousness, though," the legendary bass singer shares, "I am so grateful for all the guys who have called the Dixie Melody Boys home. Each and every one of them are very special to me."

The list of Dixie Melody Boys alumni reads like a who's who among Gospel Music's finest. Yet with all the changes, The Dixie Melody Boys and Ed O'Neal have stood the test of time. O'Neal's love for the men he has traveled with, his family, the people he has met through Gospel music, his desire to always present quality music, united with his desire to never compromise his responsibility to spread the Gospel, have made him a true Gospel music legend.

As a result of numerous health issues O'Neal encountered during 2019, he made the decision to semi-retire from the road. He added another bass singer to The Dixie Melody Boys, as he felt it important that even when he was unable to be at an engagement, the Dixie Melody Boys would deliver the same first-class experience audiences expected from the group. Just as O'Neal and the Boys were readjusting to the group's new travel model, the calendar year of 2020 unfolded.

No one was exempt from the challenges of the chaos of the worldwide pandemic in 2020, and the Southern Gospel Music world was greatly impacted. Many have continued to feel the negative effects, and according to O'Neal, The Dixie Melody Boys are no exception to this. "The past few years have been very challenging,"



O'Neal shares. "I appreciate the promoters and pastors who have supported The Dixie Melody Boys, especially over the last few years, and I commend the guys who have worked really hard to keep the legacy of The Dixie Melody Boys alive. They have represented Ed O'Neal and The Dixie Melody Boys with class, and I appreciate that; but after a very deliberate, thoughtful and prayerful period of time, I feel the best thing to honor the heritage of the Quartet is to retire the name."

As the 86-year-old singer explains, not being able to sing and travel has taken a toll on him personally. "It's hard to give up something you have done for 60 years. It's tough watching the guys roll out each week and not being able to go with them. Physically, it's just been impossible for me to do any longer." O'Neal, however, admits that he has a peace about this decision and knows it's best. "Honestly, I never imagined how good Gospel music would be to me and for me. God has blessed me more than I ever thought possible. I never dreamed 60 years ago where God would lead The Dixie Melody Boys. He has blessed us beyond measure. I have said this a million times, but the truth is, all I ever wanted to do was sing a song. I must say, I love the music now as much as I ever have, and I believe in it's message now more than ever. When my Gospel music buddies come to the area, I do my best to go see them, and I will continue to do that. I will always love the music and will always support it."

While O'Neal may be retiring The Dixie Melody Boys' name, the legacy will live on in the hearts and lives of those who have been blessed by the music created by the gentleman who has lived his life proclaiming that "all he ever wanted to do was sing a song."
