## EQUADOR MISSIONS TRIP WITH DAVE KYLLONEN AND CLIFF CERCE

#### WRITTEN BY THE LATE CLIFF CERCE



Dave Kyllonen, Cliff Cerce and 2 others went to Indiana to be trained on the water treatment plant equipment that they eventually installed in Ecuador February 2019. Unfortunately, although Dave Kyllonen went on the October 2018 trip to the Amazon jungle to plan the installation, he was too sick to go back in February 2019 to actually install the equipment; but, he was most instrumental in raising the money for the project, and Praise God, he lived long enough to hear the reports of how this project was accomplished.

Here are some pictures of our trip together. We sang an excerpt from a classic Couriers song acapella - "What the World Needs is Jesus". The men sang this in one of the most famous churches in all of South America. It is in the Ecuador capital city of Quito, and it is called "Iglesia de la Compania de Jesus", which is a Jesuit Catholic church. Construction of the church began in 1605, but was not totally completed until 160 years later in 1765. The church is plated with gold and is the most beautiful church I have ever been in.

We were told that we were not allowed to take any pictures in the church sanctuary by the very nice gentleman named Diego, who conducted our tour of the church. We learned that Diego was a foreign exchange student in West Virginia years ago, and his English was flawless. After we had left the sanctuary area, Diego asked us what we do in the United States, and we mentioned that we have done some singing. He told us that he was a singer, too, and had recorded some CDs. So, we asked him to sing us a song, and he did. He was a very good singer. Then, he asked us to sing something for him, and Dave, Mike Hammer, and I sang a Couriers tune familiar

to all of us for him, acapella. He then asked us to come back into the sanctuary and stand in front of the altar and sing that song for the people that were there seated in the pews and for those that were touring the church... and also for him... so he could take a video of us singing it with his phone. So, we asked if we could video it as well, and he gave us permission to do so. Since we were already checked out of our hotel rooms and were headed to the airport later, we were in our comfortable traveling clothes and not appropriately dressed for singing in such a majestic setting; but we did our best. Diego added the bass note on the end of our song.

Four days before he died, Dave Kyllonen called me and asked me to make sure that the remaining 4 villages in the Amazon jungle also received clean water in the future, and he even told me which of the 4 villages he wanted to receive the water treatment plant before any others. So, his missionary work is still continuing...

# THE 2024 PSGM& HOF AWARD BANQUET

Each year, the PSGMA inducts 3 individuals into the Pennsylvania Gospel Music Hall of Fame. In October 2024, another 3 well deserving friends joined the Pennsylvania Gospel Music Hall of Fame Alumni. The Banquet was held in Camp Hill, PA at the Christian Life Assembly Family Life Center. After a wonderful dinner banquet, The Down East Boys hit the stage and thrilled every listener in attendance. With their final song of the first set, folks anxiously awaited the induction ceremony.

The first individual inducted was Pastor Sam Coughenour.

Sam was born June 19, 1943, in Pittsburgh, PA, and has lived in Pennsylvania for 64 years. As a child, Sam grew up as he states, "in a poor, but happy family", where he was the youngest of 11 children. Sam recalls loving music for as long as he can remember, and at age 5, would ride his tricycle singing, "You Are My Sunshine". Sam started playing guitar at age 11, self-taught, spending hours on end, learning to play it just right. At age 13, he formed a rock and roll band, and in a few years they were traveling with a local DJ to 'record hops', with their music playing over the local radio station.

Sam's first memory of gospel music was hearing a record of Evangelist Lowell Lundstrom. In August of 1966, at an old fashioned tent meeting, Sam went from playing rock and roll to having his feet on the Rock and his name on the roll. After his salvation, he attended Zion Bible Institute, where he would hear southern gospel quartets, like The Blackwood Brothers and The Statesmen.

Throughout the different churches he has served, Sam has always promoted many different gospel music artists. Since 1971, Sam has ministered as well as promoted gospel music over the airwaves. In 1996, he went on WQZS where southern gospel music was his main format for 27 years. His wife Margie cohosted with him for 13 years.

For many years, Sam has been associated with gospel music as an artist, promoter, radio DJ, songwriter, as well as many other areas behind the scenes, making sure God's word is spread to the masses. Sam recalls a special honor to opening a concert for Jean Shepherd and Little Jimmy Dickens. Sam was very grateful as he accepted his HOF award. Brother Sam is currently pastoring in Berlin, PA at Abundant Life Christian Center, and we thank Sam for his years of service to the pulpit and to Southern Gospel Music.

The second individual inducted was Luke Hess. Born on September 11, 1961 in Frystown, PA, Luke was born and raised on a farm along with five siblings, with parents that instilled a Pennsylvania work ethic, who strove to be honest and trustworthy in their personal and professional lives. Luke attended Shirksville Mennonite Church, where his first memory of music was hymns and hearing four-part harmonies sung by all ages, with males on one side and females on the other side. He recalls singing along with the Chuck Wagon Gang while driving to and from college, developing his ability to sing all the different harmony parts, and not just the lead. Luke has served gospel music in so many facets, including artist, promoter, radio, songwriting, gospel publication and media, and so much more.

Since 1995, Luke has been founder and president of Communication Management Co., Inc., publisher of Today & Tomorrow Magazine. Luke shares a special memory of gospel music, which was was seeing the Chuck Wagon Gang live in the 1960's, when most of the original members were still traveling. Their records were the only ones permitted in the Hess home, the only ones Mennonite approved!! (LOL) Luke is still very busy as publisher of Today & Tomorrow magazine, and Dine 'N' Clip place mats, and his first love, promoting Southern Gospel Music. Congratulations, Luke!

She was a member of March Forth Qt. from 1999 to 2021, and was with them when they were named Keystone Award winners in 2007.

In 2021, after a short illness, she gained her Heavenly wings. One special thing to note, was Holly's personality. Her joyous smile, and happy, bubbly demeanor was contagious, and could brighten any room. Floyd Fehr, Holly's husband, accepted Holly's award.

#### DR. BRIAN KEITH ROSENBAUM: KNOWN BY MANY NAMES, YET KNOWN BY ALL

When you meet this large robust man, you would never forget him. He was tall, but he never looked down on anyone. He had a large belly that shook even when he told the jokes. He was known as Brother, Uncle, Pops, Pastor, Friend, or simply Brian. Brian Rosenbaum came to us from the Johnstown, PA area. He started his ministry by helping at the King's Kids Camp in Dillsburg PA, which is what brought him to the Dillsburg, PA area.

He loved working with children. I believe the true reason he worked with children was because, like him, he had that childlike faith and his love for everyone was simple, yet unwavering. Oh, the stories he would tell would sometimes make you think, is he telling you the truth or as he would say, "just using a little poetic license".

Dr. Brian Keith Rosenbaum was born on August 24, 1959 to Eugene and Deloris Rosenbaum. He had one sibling, Dawn, who loved to torment him. Of course, Brian offered the same back in jest. As much as they frustrated each other, they loved each other that much more. The time had come for Brian to leave his family's side and become a missionary to the United Kingdom. This is where he learned to drink Earl Grey Tea.

While serving as a missionary, he not only used his education from bible college, but continued on to gain his doctorate. Upon his return to the United States, he, his sister Dawn and his father had settled in the Harrisburg area. He continued on helping his family while teaching classes at the Lancaster Bible Institute. He was also teaching some of the youth at the local CMA churches in Dillsburg/Mechanicsburg area. That is where his compassion would be. He had an old white Buick and gave the kids markers and told them to go decorate his car; but the one catch was that it had to be based on a bible story. What he didn't realize is what he thought were dry erase makers were permanent!

While doing ministry, Brian also posed as the local "Santa Claus", including singing and, yes, dancing at Hershey Park. Brian was able to use Santa Claus as an "in" to bring the true Christmas Story to life. He then took on a position at King's Kids Camp in Dillsburg, PA and he developed a relationship with the Jacobs Brothers and their children. During his time there, Brian met Doug Koch through youth ministries and they not only became great friends, but brothers! Many thought they were actual brothers, since they looked almost like twins. After a couple of years, they started a music ministry with March Forth Quartet. With Brian and Doug, the remainder of the quartet was also Dan Harmon and Bill Hamm, both from Dillsburg.

It's funny how God puts folks together, because Dan came from the Air Force and was a perfectionist with harmonies. Bill was one of those that if you didn't know him, he seemed to be a grumpy old man, but loved singing with the group. Brian sang with the March Forth Quartet for several years, but due to health issues had to resign from the quartet. He was still serving as a youth pastor, but he didn't stop singing. Even with all the health issues, Brian continued to enjoy God allowing him to have some of the limelight. One of my favorite times with him was to have him, Kevin Good (of Heaven 4 Shore), and myself sing 'Somewhere Overweight People'.

Doug was the technical one that handled the sound equipment and Brian was the spokesperson. never knew what was going to come out of his mouth. Brian always said, "God has a sense of humor. We sang together for the first time on April Fool's Day and our first concert was at a Mother-Daughter Banquet." During this time with the quartet, Brian came to the group and advised that he was hired as the youth pastor at Why At the Well in Mechanicsburg, PA. The kids and adults at Why at the Well fell in love with him. Of course, those that know Why at the Well is that it's a fun, but 'grow in Christ' center, where you can use a computer, play games, have fun, and a gym. It also doubles as Landmark Baptist Church. While there, Pastor Bob and Brian had a lot of great times together.

Brian came from a humble beginning in Johnstown, PA. While traveling with March Forth Quartet, he made many ventures home to see his grandmother that still resided in Johnstown. Of course, he would schedule the group to sing over that way as much as he could, as well and making many stops at Friendship Village in Bedford, PA. I remember one trip that Brian and I made was to pick up his grandmother in January, so that she could attend his Birthday Celebration!

Brian did not celebrate his earthly birthday, but his Spiritual Birthday each year. He would invite everyone to come, since this was his most exciting day of his year! Unfortunately, this would be his grandmother's last celebration. Brian and I would go to her burial place knowing she was not there, but the peace that surrounded us there made it always special. While we were there, we threw birdseed and breadcrumbs out to the birds, squirrels and deer and they would even come up and eat while we were there. Brian shared so many memories and stories that I could probably fill several books.

So, to call him a brother, many people thought we were actually siblings. We were siblings in the Lord's eyes, but to many we were a lot alike; but most of all, those that said they loved the Lord could say he was their brother, too! Some of those around him during 'Summer Fun' at Why at the Well would call him Uncle Brian, because he usually had a treat for them to snack on. He was called Pops by many of his adopted children, both through legal and through the Lord. He was called friend by all those that know him, as he was a friend to all.

Everyone and anyone could always call him Love, because the Lord was shown through him and was infectious to the heart! His passion was to see everyone dedicate their lives to the Lord, no matter what age, what size, what gender, what race, and what religion! I am going to close with his normal: not goodbye, but "May the Lord be with you"; and his expected response was ... "and with you ALWAYS!"

#### LOOKING BACK FONDLY

In the early years, we were comprised of 4 singers and a piano player; our mode of travel was 4 door sedans and later in a Cadillac limousine which we bought from a funeral director. We then bought a '48 model bus and drove it 500,000 miles and sold it to a group called The Orells. One trip out west, a cracked primary filter allowed us to only drive 35 MPH. We drove from Utah to Las Vegas, NV, which was quite the trip. One trip West, we and the Country Gospel group called THE CHRISTIAN TROUBADORS were traveling in CANADA to a concert. About 50 miles from our destination, the Troubadors's bus engine died. We were in the middle of nowhere; we pushed their bus 50 miles to our next concert.

We were contacted by a church in downtown Baltimore to do a concert. Just before arriving at the church, a rainstorm had flooded an underground electrical unit, leaving the church without power. We had a generator in our bus and the church found some extension cords. The church wanted an altar call, which we usually did anyway. The church had printed up cards for anyone who accepted Christ. They ran out of cards! God honored that church's outreach. Having been raised in church and believing in altar calls, or at least a challenge as part of our calling, we never failed to do so very often. We could not rationalize being away so much from family without a challenge.

Some of our ministry was not singing. One example stands out. All of our group had gone to Christian Camps in our youth and we knew the value of gathering together as youth. So, we started our own 7-day youth camp in Pennsylvania. Our contact with so many churches in the Northeast allowed us to minister to over 300 young people a year for 20 years. We still hear from so many of those young people now, grown up and living for the Lord.

We conducted a two week camp meeting in Landisville, PA each summer. Our television ministry blossomed when WGAL TV in Lancaster contacted us about doing a Sunday morning program! That was truly God's plan. WGAL TV is the most watched TV outlet in our area and was the 10th largest market for NBC in the nation. To God be the glory. I still remember the man's name from WGAL. It was Christmas time. His first words were, "HOW WOULD YOU LIKE A CHRISTMAS PRESENT?"

We then had a Courier Day at HERHEY PARK. The park was closed to the general public until 5 PM. We sang at least 5 times, all half hour concerts. When the park opened to the public at 5, the evening entertainment group came into the dressing room where we were changing. On the wall was a chart where it was written the amount of people who attended each show. The charts on the wall for our days said sold out! Then we told them about Couriers Day. Those days were fun days!

I remember driving one afternoon over three hours to a church date. When we arrived, we noticed that there were only 4-5 cars. Upon entering, one of the men said he was the pastor of the church. He informed us that we were booked for the following week! The pastor and his board were having a board meeting. Another time, we were going to sing in Hamilton Ontario, Canada. Hamilton is a solid 7-hour drive from home in good weather. It was snowing when we started the trip. We called the pastor about canceling, but he insisted we honor our date and in several inches deep of snow. When we met the pastor, he informed us he canceled the service two hours ago; (I think he offered us some tea for our trouble). I have told you of some bad times. Here is a good and thoughtful time: we booked a date on one of our 50 odd trips to California that treated us very well. We received, while already in California, that the church was in the midst of a powerful revival and did not want to interrupt this move of GOD; of course, we understood this. In the mail a few days later,

we received a check for \$800 from the prior church, apologizing for having to cancel.

Early concert paychecks were \$25.00. We suggested \$125.00 per service and were criticized for even asking. When we started filling churches all over the reach of WGAL TV, we saw plates filled to overflowing with money, but we were still criticized for asking a fee. To this day, we never signed contracts unless demanded by a promoter. I am not complaining, but just being honest and transparent. My fellow partners in the group never complained. I have heard Neil Enloe say over and over that God has always been our source of supplying our needs, not necessarily our wants. I will never forget Neil's story about our needs being met. When The COURIERS disbanded for a time several years ago, we all continued in solo ministries. On one occasion, Neil sang at a very large church in a neighboring state. His in-laws went to hear Neil. An offering was taken for Neil. After the service the pastor did

not offer a meal as many do. So, Neil and family had dinner together. Somehow the subject of what he was paid came up. This was unusual, because Neil never discussed money much. Neil's mother-in-law asked Neil if he was paid well. Neil responded that he had not even looked at his check. He pulls out the check and tells the family the amount was less than \$200. Neil's mother-in-law was irate. She had put a check in the offering of \$75.00; case closed. Two weeks later, a Bible School friend, now pastor of a church in Longmont, CO asked Neil to fly to Longmont to play a brand new grand piano dedicated to the memory of some church member. The church paid airfare, hotel, food and \$2,000, plus selling his solo CD recordings.

Dave, Duane and Neil don't have much of earth's riches, but the story continues now with all their children and now grandchildren, who are involved in ministry. The Legacy continues.
