THE 2025 PSGMA HOF AWARD BANQUET

Each year, the PSGMA inducts 3 individuals into the Pennsylvania Gospel Music Hall of Fame. In October 2025, another 3 well-deserving friends joined the Pennsylvania Gospel Music Hall of Fame Alumni. As it was for the last few years, the HOF banquet was held in Camp Hill, PA at the Christian Life Assembly Family Life Center. After a wonderful banquet, The Keystone Award winner Floyd Foster ministered in music, followed by The Kingsmen, who hit the stage and thrilled every listener in attendance. After their final song of the first set, folks anxiously awaited the inductee ceremony.

The first individual inducted was Daryl Mellott. Daryl was born into a musical family in the mid-20th century. His mother, Romaine, who was a recent 2019 inductee to the PSGMA Hall of Fame, was the church organist and choir director. She made sure that music was a part of the family. All 7 members of the family played an instrument of some kind. At the age of 9, Daryl was handed a trombone and quickly learned to make it work. He did extremely well and played in all the high school bands as well as 4 years in County band and orchestra, 4 years in Regional band and orchestra, and 2 years at the State level. When he was 15, Daryl started playing bass guitar in some local rock bands. It was at a regional band concert where a director of music heard Daryl play and offered him a full scholarship to study music at Austin Peay University in Clarksville, TN, just a little west of Nashville. It was there that Daryl got involved in many different facets of music, playing in top 40's bands, hard rock of the 60's and 70's, and country, playing at various venues and night clubs. Daryl even had stints on the Johnny Carson show and the Grand Ole Opry. It was also where Daryl met and married his wife Cena, who is also a very talented musician. Upon moving back to Pennsylvania, Daryl continued

to play in various bands throughout Harrisburg, York, and Philadelphia.

In 1976, Daryl formed a small gospel group to help out a friend, and his group called Chapter VII was formed. They have performed and presented the Word of God through their music to all who would listen. They've always performed with live music with no recorded sound tracks, and the group has numbered as many as 12 members at one time, to the current lineup of the traditional 4 singers, piano and bass guitar. In November of 2025, Daryl celebrated 50 years of performing and promoting Southern Gospel Music. Daryl Mellott also currently serves as the vice president of the PSGMA.

The second individual inducted at the 2025 banquet was Kerry Kerstetter Seger. Kerry was born on March 9, 1968 to Forrest and Betty Kerstetter, and raised along with her siblings, Forrest Jr, Wendy, and Bradley. Kerry started singing in public at just 3 years old. Stories are told of the family piano being marked up by the playpen while the family was singing and playing. That was Kerry's way of joining in.

At the age of 5, the family and Kerry sang for the camp services at Knoebels, as well as J&D Campgrounds with the Shamokin Area Christian Laymens. It was at one of those services that she asked Jesus in her heart. Kerry attended Bethel Union Chapel, a church built by her great uncle, and the church that her mother played piano at until her passing. She and her family still attend there, with pastor Dave Butler, and a church family that they dearly love. Kerry remembers gospel music being a part of her life for as long as she can recollect. In 1976, The Kerstetter Family entered a talent contest at the 'all night sing' at the Harrisburg Farm Show arena. It was Kerry's first time to sing with the "big groups" as they called them. They were excited to win the contest and Kerry was even more excited (as an 8-year old girl) as Duane Nicholson of the Couriers handed the trophy to her. Just a few more years and Kerry learned that awards are nice, but sharing the love and saving power of Jesus Christ through music was even better.

As the Kerstetter Family went on to sing more and more with more "big name groups", Kerry enjoyed learning how to better herself in gospel music with what and how to do things, and what not to do, and with that came the desire to sing full time. One day while working as a secretary in a recording studio, God reinforced to her that even if she didn't sing gospel music full time, she could still work for HIM full time, and that changed her whole outlook on life. Kerry met her husband Jamie in 1990, and they were wed in the Spring of 1992. Her mother Betty passed away in 1993, which was a very difficult time, and the family stopped singing for a few years. (Her mother Betty Kerstetter was inducted into the PSGMA Hall of Fame in 2001.)

In 1995, they regrouped and started traveling again. In 2007, they took another break, as her brother Brad had terminal cancer. At the same time, Kerry and Jamie had just started their family and had 2 small children. In 2009, Kerry and Jamie were asked to sing for a Sunday school picnic, and after much prayer, they said yes; that started their new family ministry, The Seger Family. The group consists of Jamie, Kerry, their son Seth, their daughter Kinsley, and good friend Dan Clark. Kerry feels thankful for the heritage passed down through her parents, and feels extremely blessed to be traveling and singing still today with her husband and children, serving Jesus through music and song. Kerry Kerstetter Seger is now a proud member of the PSGMA Hall of Fame.

The last individual that was inducted was Dave Powers. Dave was born on December 15, 1966 in West Chester, PA. As a child, Dave was raised in a Christian home, the youngest of several siblings. He attended several churches throughout his childhood, including the Church of Goshenville, West Chester Nazarene, and Landmark Baptist of Exton, PA. Dave also attended and graduated from Grace Baptist Christian school of Coatesville. Dave learned to love southern gospel music at an early age, with his favorite groups being The Cathedrals, The Kingsmen and Gold City. As a young adult, he enjoyed singing in the church choir, and later went on to sing with the Towne Singers for many years. In 2010, Dave felt the calling to start his solo ministry. I enjoyed sharing the platform many times with Dave throughout Pennsylvania. He was very serious about his calling. Along with his solo ministry, Dave also enjoyed singing with his duet partner Jessica Snyder in their duet group Cross-N-Country, as well as his trio group called Country Church Trio, with the addition of Ann Cunningham. One of Dave's favorite memories was being called up to sing bass with one of his all-time favorite groups, The Kingsmen. One of his funniest memories was singing at Rolling Acres Gospel Sing one night and singing the wrong words; instead of singing Teach Me Lord to Wait, he sang Teach Me Lord to Faint. Dave was received into his Heavenly Father's arms September 14th of 2022, and he is now singing bass in the Heavenly Choir. His niece Christina Ford was on hand to honor Dave and accept his Hall of Fame plaque for him.

THE ORIGIN OF THE COURIERS

At Central Bible Institute (CBI) in Springfield, Missouri, where I was starting my junior year, I heard that there would be quartet tryouts that evening. On a whim, I went. To my surprise, quartet groups were already organized. The music teachers listened to each group, then asked me to sing a solo. Individuals from the combined groups were picked - a bass, a baritone and a tenor, after which they asked me if I could sing high tenor. I couldn't believe my good fortune! (I must have hit a high note.) And thus, the new school quartet, the "Revivalaires" was launched.

We sang in local churches and churches out of the area that requested a quartet. We were invited to sing in Taylorville, Ill. for Thanksgiving. It wasn't just one service; it was four - Friday, Saturday, Sunday morning and Sunday night. By that night, my "high tenor" voice couldn't even speak, much less sing. Then on the way back to school that night our baritone announced that he was dropping out. He was too busy with studies; things were not looking good.

That week, there was a visit from a student I didn't even know - Roger Kling. Roger had his own quartet. He had been in another group the year before. He had a lead singer in his current group (that the rest could not work with). He asked if I would sing lead for them. I didn't even hesitate. I knew I was not a high tenor. (Needless to say, the "Revivalaires" was disbanded). Roger was a good leader. He knew the current gospel music. He could arrange music. He could play piano. He could direct. After supper one

evening, a small crowd gathered in the chapel to hear our first song - "I'll Leave It All Behind." The response was positive (What could they say?).

We soon began to get invitations from churches; one problem remained - we had no name. He said he wanted something different from the usual run of the mill names. Then one day, a fellow student asked if we had thought of the word, "Courier". He said it means, "a messenger sent in haste with an important message." We all agreed - that was meaningful. That fit a Bible School group carrying the gospel wherever they went.

Roger was ambitious. When the Blackwoods (the epitome of gospel music at that time) came to our neck of the woods (Springfield), he managed to get them to let us sing at their concert. Then there were talks between Roger and the school's administration, and soon we learned we were going to be traveling for the school - to promote it - encouraging other youth to come to CBI. We then had records made (78 RPM's in those days - one song on each side), group pictures [including piano player Jim Collins for that summer] and matching suits. The school let us use the school's Suburban and covered our expenses. We all took turns preaching. It was an unforgettable summer!

We continued traveling throughout the following school year - Missouri, Kansas, Arkansas - even once to Texas (long weekend) - using our high tenor's car.

Roger wanted us to do it again the following summer - on our own - developing our own itinerary, buying our own car, etc. I was his roommate and agreed. Mistake! Lem, our high tenor, and Cliff, our bass, "took a pass." Roger found some fill-ins and we hit the road. (I won't go into detail, but we barely survived).

When school started again in the fall of 1955 - 1956, the only original Couriers was Lem Boyles, our high tenor. (Roger and I had graduated and taken positions in churches where we had sung.) Lem began putting the pieces back together again. A fellow student, Dave Kyllonen, sang bass. (For once the group had a real bass.) Then Don Baldwin, a fellow we had met in Las Vegas in the military, now a new CBI student, became the baritone. He was a man with a good business head. An "anonymous" student was the lead.

The following year (1956-1957), Duane Nicholson, a freshman, became the lead singer. Duane had a trained tenor voice. Finally, in the fall of 1957, the quartet was complete with Neil Enloe, a man of many talents, including being a song writer, became the lead singer, bumping Duane up to high tenor. Unlike me in the "Revivalaires", he could handle it. (Lem, our high tenor, had graduated.) With this foursome, things settled down ... for years.

The rest, as they say, is history. For more, read Dave Kyllonen's book, "Out of the Ordinary" and another book entitled "The Final Quarter", wrapping up 60 years of gospel ministry from the fall of 1953 to the fall of 2013.

Bible school quartets come and go. This one lasted. How blessed I was when "on a whim" I crashed the tryouts that fall night in 1953. God is good!

CONTINUING ON THE NARROW ROAD

In last edition's article, I left off at taking time to reach out to friends and loved ones you haven't seen or talked to in some time, and to give some quality time to them. This may require an effort on our part, but we never know what they may be going through.

I want to concentrate now on making sure you take time for yourself. What I mean by this is that we tend to get busy with many things around us, such as taking kids to their sports games or perhaps you said you would take care of something for someone else. It seems like we have time for everything else, but not our quiet time to devote to being 'Alone with God'. Being alone with God doesn't mean you have to feel isolated. Healthy aloneness is called solitude; solitude is a peaceful time with God. It doesn't need to be feeling lonesome, but welcoming. It is an invitation to be with God and your own thoughts. We find in Matthew 14:23 that even Jesus needed that solitude time - for it tells us, "And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone."

Why is solitude important to God? Through solitude, we create space for God's presence, speaking and listening to God and simply loving Him and being loved. Solitude allows the Spirit of God to interject His thoughts and desires into our souls. In solitude, seek God himself, listening for His voice and enjoying His love. In Exodus 33:7-11 we read that Moses met with God in the tabernacle, speaking with Him face to face.

This allows us to have exposure to God's wisdom. God is all-wise and all-knowing. You can't spend time alone with Him and remain ignorant. Acts 4:13 says that when the religious leaders saw the boldness of Peter and John and perceived that they were uneducated and untrained men, they marveled; and they realized that they had been with Jesus. You can't spend time with the Lord and not end up being wiser than you are now.

When you spend time alone with God, you not only gain renewal of physical strength, you also enjoy spiritual refueling and refreshment. Isaiah 40:31 says, "Those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint." God promises to guide us all the way through our lives. Psalm 48:14 says, "For this God is our God forever and ever; He will be our guide, even to the end." But how do we receive this guidance? Psalm 48:9 says, "meditating on your unfailing love". The secret of guidance is alone time with God – meditating on His word. WOW, what a gift we receive in our alone time with the Lord! Now with this comes experience, conviction and correction. Psalm 17:4,5 says, "I have followed your commands, which keep me from following cruel and evil people. My steps have stayed on your path; I have not wavered from following You." The Bible has its unique ability to convict men and women of their sins. Often God will use his Word to gently correct us and lead us onto a steady path.

And finally, we get to God's great reward because He rewards the time spent alone with Him in prayer. Matthew 6:5,6 says, "And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father, who sees you in secret will reward you." God's will, His nearness, His goodness, His love – rewards feely given to those who commune with Him. All the money in the world cannot buy the rewards God longs to give you as you commune with Him. As busy folks, don't forget to prioritize alone time with God. It's the best gift you will ever receive; one on one communion with your Heavenly Father. In a world where we are inundated with media, people, stress, and work from the moment we wake up, God has a life-giving opportunity for each of us – alone time with Him. Take time to meditate on Mark 1:35, "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed."

Do you think you could commit to twenty minutes each day for the next week for quiet solitude time with God? Watch how it changes you!

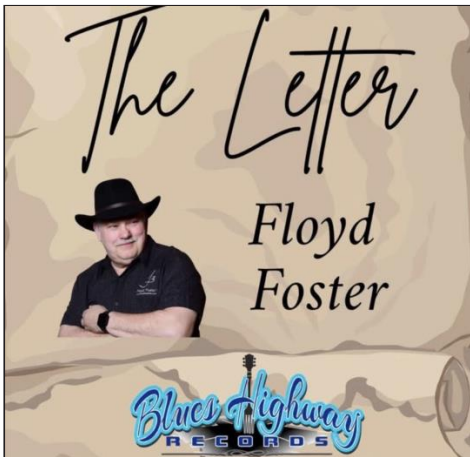
